(This computer list on recycling and safe disposal is considered a work in progress.)

NEW STATE OF WISCONSIN E-WASTE RULE, Jan.1, 2010, prohibits landfill disposal or incineration of certain electronics as of Sept.1, 2010, designed to keep old computers and televisions out of landfills.

The State of Wisconsin made recycling mandatory for everyone in Wisconsin, as of Jan. 1, 1995. A few local municipalities, such as Howards Grove and Town of Wilson passed similar local ordinances to better support and enforce the Wisconsin ordinance.

SINGLE-STREAM RECYCLING:

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY cities, most all villages and several townships have adopted the **single-stream recycling program** where aluminum and other metal food and beverage cans, glass bottles and jars and designated plastic containers, also various types of paper (see PAPER RECYCLING) can be placed in plastic BLUE BAGS as CO-MINGLED RECYCLABLES for curbside pickup with weekly garbage collection. The local service, in addition, may also take aluminum food trays, also clean plastic containers (No. 1-7) besides plastic bottles and jugs.

Single-stream recycling is currently, as of January 2010 offered by:

City of Sheboygan, City of Plymouth, City of Sheboygan Falls, most all villages in Sheboygan County and several townships, including Town of Sheboygan and Town of Sheboygan Falls, using either Veolia or Larry's Hauling. Sheboygan DPW rules:

ALUMINUM:

Sheboygan Recycling Company, 1206 Illinois Avenue takes and pays for clean, dry aluminum beverage cans, cat food cans, also disposable but clean aluminum food trays, pie plates, and muffin tins. To reach Sheboygan Recycling, take Indiana Avenue to 11th Street, turn north, go one block to Illinois Ave, then turn left (west), and go one block.

Two Scrap Metal dealers on N. 21st Street just north of North Avenue in Sheboygan, Sheboygan Scrap Metals and Holman Scrap Metal, will take aluminum clean food trays, pie plates, beverage cans and other aluminum objects of many sizes. (check for prices pd)

Veolia will take aluminum cans along with other Co-Mingled Recyclables in certain designated dumpsters contracted by businesses and apartment/complexes in Sheboygan and Sheboygan County.

Campers and visitors to **Kohler-Andrae State Park** can put aluminum beverage cans, other metal cans and designated recyclables in Veolia dumpsters labeled Co-mingled Recyclables near the campground host corner at west side of park.

SINGLE STREAM curbside garbage and recycling services may also take clean aluminum food trays, including for the City of Sheboygan as of Jan. 4, 2010. Put in plastic BLUE BAG with other Co-Mingled recyclables. Check with city, village or town hall clerk's offices regarding local curbside services for additional aluminum items.

ALUMINUM CANS only:

Put aluminum beverage cans in plastic BLUE BAG with other Co-mingled recyclables with weekly curbside collection in all communities offering **Single-stream recycling:**

The City of Sheboygan, City of Plymouth, City of Sheboygan Falls, most villages in Sheboygan County and several townships, including Town of Sheboygan and Town of Sheboygan Falls will accept aluminum cans, and some also will accept aluminum food trays, including the City of Sheboygan. Clerk's offices for cities, villages or town halls provide specific recycling preparation details.

Other aluminum can recycling spots:

Cedar Grove: Aluminum cans that are emptied and rinsed are accepted at the village drop-off site dumpsters at E. Willow Ave. and N. Commerce St., Saturdays 8am-2pm.

Elkhart Lake: an ALUMINUM CAN RECYCLE CAGE is at 51 E. Maple Street next to Village Garage, in addition to curbside blue bag collection.

Town of Wilson: town residents may bring aluminum cans to the Town of Wilson Maintenance/Drop Off Site, 920-980-0198 on Meyer Road just off OK frontage Road on west side of I-43, Sat. 8-4 pm, Tues. 8-5pm, also other designated recyclables, yard waste and other items. Residents can order curb-service pickup of garbage only. Sometimes the Drop-off Site is still referred by locals as the Town of Wilson dump.

BAGS as in PLASTIC BAGS: take to any local Wal-Mart. Recycle box is just inside entrance doors. Remove any slips from bags, turn inside out, place in recycle box. Also accepting clean grocery-store-size plastic bags (Sheboygan locations): Mead Public Library on 8th Street, Piggly Wiggly (south side Sheb.) and Fringe Benefits Thrift Shop (also wants larger plastic bags) located in Taylor Heights Shopping Ctr. off Taylor Dr.

BATTERIES: as in worn-out vehicle batteries (see Vehicle Batteries listing). Batteries as in worn out rechargeable batteries, other batteries see (Batteries under Electronics.) **MANY KINDS OF BATTERIES, taken for recycling at BATTERIES PLUS,** Taylor Heights Shopping Center, including lithium, zinc air, silver oxide batteries & also rechargeable. Batteries accepted for hearing aids, computers, glucose testers, watches, dog collars, toys, film cameras, digital cameras, remotes and car remotes.

BULBS as in ECO-LIGHT BULBS (locations):

Home Depot, Deer Trace Plaza, at I-43 (Kohler), **Evan’s Variety Store in Sheboygan Falls,** and **Menards** north of Sheboygan. Also at special hazardous waste collections for Sheboygan County several times a year, contact Jim Hulbert, 459-3765 at the Sheboygan County Planning Resources Dept.

At Home Depot, take worn-out Eco Bulbs inside store entrance, and turn right to the “Return Desk.” Put each light bulb inside a plastic bag provided by store, if not already in a plastic bag and place in designated container near Return Desk. The stores do not accept the longer fluorescent tubes.

Menard’s off Hwy 42 accepts burned out (but not broken) Eco-Bulbs to be turned in to a person behind a counter located just beyond its check-outs, next to the EXIT doors.

ECO-BULB WARNING: All Eco-Bulbs have a small amount of Hazardous Waste Mercury inside them that could drop on floor, carpet or other surface when a bulb breaks. **SPECIAL CLEANUP is needed WITHOUT USING** water, vacuum cleaners, or bare hands or brooms. Don’t shampoo carpet. Keep children and pets away from area where the bulb broke. Clean up broken bulb residue using protective gloves (if possible), small sheets of paper, newspaper or little sheets of cardboard and do not discard in garbage or trash. For general safety place broken Eco-bulb pieces and paper with residue inside a plastic bag and fasten securely. Take to a designated recycle location. In some cases a small section of carpet may need to be cut out and replaced.

ELECTRONICS:

ELECTRONICS COLLECTIONS ARE HELD EACH YEAR BY THE SHEBOYGAN COUNTY PLANNING AND RESOURCES DEPARTMENT to recycle computers, TVs, dehumidifiers, and other electronic appliances. This more comprehensive recycling and safe disposal program is **part of the County’s Household Hazardous Waste Clean Sweep Program.** (announcement on page 2 of this section)

BATTERIES as in worn-out **RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES:** (Multiple Locations): **Home Depot** entrance next to Return Desk, just inside entrance. Place in container. **Best Buy,** just inside front entrance doors. **Batteries Plus,** just inside entrance door at right.

PRINTER CARTRIDGES FOR INKJET PRINTERS: Take to **Best Buy,** deposit just inside entrance doors. Accepted at **Office Max,** Sheboygan, at check-out or by clerks.

CELLPHONES: Best Buy, just inside front entrance doors. **BATTERIES PLUS** in Taylor Heights Shopping Center takes old cell phones, hand-held games, MP3 players.

TV SETS (up to 32 inch screen only): **Best Buy**, take to customer service counter, pay a \$10 fee for each TV, then accept a Best Buy gift card for \$10 towards any purchase at the store. Store accepts 2 electronic items per household per day.

VHS recorders and players: **Best Buy**, take to customer service counter. Store accepts 2 electronic items per household per day.

DVD recorders and players: **Best Buy**, take to customer service counter. Store accepts 2 electronic items per household per day.

CD Players: **Best Buy**, take to customer service counter. Store accepts 2 electronic items per household per day.

COMPUTERS: (multiple locations)

Best Buy off I-43, Exit 123, west frontage road 920-458-5710 (recycling of computers): Store will accept two computer items only on a single day, such as a monitor with up to a 32 inch screen (\$10 fee for any CRT or laptop) and a disc drive (no extra charge.) Store staff wipe the disc drives clean before stacking for pick-up by the company's Shuttle service for future recycling or disposal. A trade-in service also has been offered on specific electronic items that are still in excellent condition, as of March 2009. Check with local store customer service staff for on-line procedure to be followed.

Milwaukee PC in downtown Sheboygan, 516 N. 8th St, Ph. 803-0058

Milwaukee PC (recycling of computers): Store will take monitor, disc drive tower, keyboard, also laptops. Will wipe disc drive clean before storing for pick-up. Some disc drive towers are recycled in Sheboygan County. Computer components are picked up monthly by the MKE PC company parts truck. No charge for disposal of the computer. If computer owner wants a disc drive wiped and then returned, there is about a \$40 charge. If the computer owner wants "Windows" reinstalled, then the charge is more.

Elkhart Lake resident's option for computer disposal: Larry's Hauling will pick up computer components with curbside pick-up and computer monitors for an extra \$15 charge. Residents need to call in and give name, address and phone number for billing process in order to have a computer monitor picked up at curbside. No charge for other components.

EARTHWISE RECYCLING, LLC: 920-467-9951, recycles holiday lights, computer monitors, printers, VCRs, TVs, cellphones, other electronic devices and non-pcb light ballasts. Small local business in rural Sheboygan Falls area. Phone first for drop-off directions so that a person is available to accept. Some pick-ups, depending on amount or

size. No charge to donate most electronics. Small charge for TVs and for Computer monitors and printers. Email: earthwiserecycling@wildblue.net

EXTENDING THE USEFUL LIFE OF ITEMS in a variety of ways:

Several repair shops exist around Sheboygan and Sheboygan County, including 4 on Michigan Ave. near 10th Street in Sheboygan – **Arnst Zipper Repair**, **Johnnie’s Bike Shop** (new and used), **Mantz Vac Center** (new, used and rebuilt vacs), and **Molly’s Cobbler Shop** for repair of shoes and boots. **The Sewing Machine Shop** in Sheboygan Falls, 860 Monroe Street, 920-467-3135, according to several sources, may be the only shop left in Sheboygan County that does sewing machine repair. Furniture repair businesses around the county include: **Glen Grunow** on County Trunk O, Sheboygan Falls, **Hartman’s Furniture Service** on S. 8th St. and **Sheboygan Upholstery** on N. 13th St., Sheboygan and **Ver Velde Finishing** on Center Ave in Oostburg.

Note: Used Bookstores extend the life of books, paper, and music. Thrift shops, consignment shops, estate sales, rummage sales, garage sales, and also library sales of used books, magazines, CDs and VHS videos extend the useful life of many items.

EYEGLASSES Donations (multiple Sheboygan locations): “Old” eyeglasses to **VFW Post 9156** at 552 S. Evans across from Wildwood Cemetery, (920) 458-0801, also to **VFW Wolf Post 1230**, at 1138 Union Ave., (920) 457-9775, during hours when both posts are open. Eyeglasses also accepted at **Medical Eye Associates**, 1442 N. 31st St., on the corner of 31st Street and Superior Avenue, across from the south side of St. Nicholas Hospital. Place eyeglasses in wall box in breezeway near entrance. Old eyeglasses and hearing aids accepted by **Glanders Pharmacy**, 3529 Superior Ave.

FREecycle: person-to-person recycling of free items by listing each item on an internet Yahoo group called SHEBOYGAN, WISCONSIN FREecycle (TM). Everything posted must be free, legal, and appropriate for all ages. **Internet navigation:** Go to www.freecycle.net (the page gives an overview of national program). Go to www.freecycle.org. Type -- Sheboygan, WI -- inside search box, then click on Sheboygan. Then click on -- Visit Sheboygan Yahoo Page. In order to participate in this group, click on Join This Group. Get a Yahoo ID by clicking on SIGNUP. Use Yahoo ID to sign on to the Freecycle Yahoo Group for Sheboygan in order to get permission to read and post messages. The free membership in Sheboygan FreeCycle allows the posting and reading to take place. Arrangements for pickup can be made by exchanging e-mail messages.

FREON APPLIANCE SAFE DISPOSAL:

(County-wide) Collected for a fee from any Sheboygan County resident at any of the household hazardous waste collection events sponsored by the Sheboygan County Planning and Resources Department. Call 920-459-3060 for more information.

(For Elkhart Lake residents only) Freon appliance pick-up for refrigerators, freezers, and dehumidifiers are taken at curbside on scheduled garbage collection day at no extra cost. Item must be called in to Larry's Hauling.

(Open to public for drop-off) Veolia Environmental Services, 2905 Paine Ave., Sheboygan, 458-6030 accepts freon appliances for \$100.00 per appliance. No pick-up.

GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS:

Put glass bottles and jars in plastic BLUE BAG with co-mingled recyclables with weekly curbside collection in all communities offering **Single-stream recycling:**

The City of Sheboygan, City of Plymouth, City of Sheboygan Falls, most all villages in Sheboygan County and several townships, including Town of Sheboygan and Town of Sheboygan Falls. Clerk's offices for the cities, villages and town halls provide specific recycling preparation details.

Note: Sheboygan DPW Dept. rules www.ci.sheboygan.wi.us For county, check www.co.sheboygan.wi.us click on departments, click on Planning Dept. and scroll down to new items and announcements, then click on: Sheboygan County Residents Info on Municipalities Recycling and Waste Collection for added details.

Other glass bottle and jar recycling spots:

Taken at specified **Veolia** dumpsters for businesses and apartment/condo complexes.

Kohler-Andrae State Park: Taken at co-mingled recyclables dumpster at west end of park near campground host corner as a service to campers and park visitors.

Cedar Grove: Glass (brown, green and clear, rinsed and with caps removed) along with plastics bagged together in clear bags, also emptied and rinsed aluminum cans are accepted at the village's drop-off site dumpsters, E. Willow Ave. and N. Commerce St., Sat. 8am-2pm..

Town of Wilson: taken at its Maintenance Building/Drop-off Site, 920-980-0198, at 4430 Meyer Court just off the OK frontage road, west of I-43 still referred to be some locals as the Town of Wilson dump. Hours for drop off are Sat, 8-4pm, and Tues, 8-5 pm. Blue bagged co-mingled recyclables, also bundled paper and other specified items accepted for drop-off at dumpsters by Larry's Hauling. There is also a garbage compactor at the site for residents who do not order curbside garbage pick-up.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY RESTORE (2 locations): Take excellent-condition lighting fixtures, mirrors with no chips or scratches, and many other house redecorating items or building supplies, including doors and windows. Town of Sheboygan location, 4110 Hwy 42, about 1.5 miles north of Quarry Park and a half mile from the I-43 exit. Plymouth location, 3003 Eastern Avenue (County Trunk C) across from Fleet Farm entrance. Plymouth, 920-892-4175 Town of Sheboygan, 920-452-4175

HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTS SAFE DISPOSAL: Several collections are held each year by the Sheboygan County Planning and Resources Department. Safe disposal includes comprehensive electronics recycling using Veolia Environmental Services for TVs and Computers where only 1 to 2 percent of collected electronics ends

up in a landfill, according to Jim Hulbert, Director, Sheboygan County Planning Resources Dept., 459-3765, 508 New York Ave, Sheboygan.

Materials accepted in the hazardous waste collection include: flammable liquids, oil-based paints, solvents, varnishes, thinners, reactives (typically pool chemicals), fluorescent bulbs, household batteries, acids and bases, old gasoline, pesticides and herbicides, cleaners, aerosols, poisons, and antifreeze, at no charge to Sheboygan County households. Fees will be charged for small businesses and agricultural businesses who may wish to participate.

Computers will be recycled for an extra charge of \$15 per monitor, CPU, or printer. TVs, dehumidifiers and air conditioners will be accepted for an added charge of \$25 or more.

For updated information anytime, or checking on current collections that may begin as early as March, **check Sheboygan County website: www.co.Sheboygan.wi.us (then click on departments, then click on planning and scroll down to new items and announcements.)** The Clean Sweep Collection, which includes electronics, is planned for Friday afternoon May 14, 1-6 pm and Saturday morning May 15, 8-11am.

HEARING AIDS: Collection boxes placed by the **Sheboygan Lions Club** for hearing aids no longer being used, at Sheboygan locations: **Advanced Hearing Care**, 717 Michigan Ave., 920-452-0641, **Glanders Prescription Drug**, 3529 Superior Ave, 920-459-2755. **Hearing aid batteries accepted by Batteries Plus**, Taylor Heights Shopping Ctr, 920-459-9494

MOTOR OIL SAFE DISPOSAL (multiple locations):

Business and municipality locations for used Motor Oil Safe Disposal:

Mobil 1 Lube Express (3 locations in Sheboygan):

Mobil 1 Lube Express on the corner of 14th and Indiana Avenue; Mobil 1 Lube Express on Calumet Drive about a block north of North Avenue; Mobil 1 Lube Express near Car Express a block south of the Washington Avenue and Taylor Drive intersection.

Mobil 1 Lube Expresses accept “Do It Yourself” motor oil for recycling during regular business hours only (M-F 8am-6pm, Sat. 8-4 pm, and Sun. 10 am-3 pm.) Mobile Oil Corp. office: 920-459-5640

Advance Auto Parts, 2820 S. Business Drive near where Wilson Avenue comes into South Business Drive, accepts used vehicle oil for disposal Mon-Sat.7:30 am-9pm, Sun. 9am-8pm. 920-452-2790

Prestige Motors, Prestige Re-Upholstery, 1929 N. 18th St., Sheboygan, accepts used motor oil during business hours. 920-458-5775

City of Sheboygan: Sheboygan Department of Public Works on New Jersey Avenue at driveway entrance for recycling branches and yard waste, also takes used motor oil, worn out vehicle batteries, and scrap metal only from Sheboygan residents. The hours are Mon-Sat. 8am-4pm. Be prepared to prove city residency. DPW, 920-459-3366

Elkhart Lake: a drum for collection of waste oil is located at the Village Garage, 51 E. Maple, Wed. 2 to 6 pm and Sat. 10-3pm April to Oct.

Plymouth: Valvoline Oil Change, 1950 Eastern Ave., Plymouth, 920-893-6101 during business hours.

Town of Wilson Maintenance/Drop-off Site: 920-980-0198 at 4430 Meyer Court just off OK frontage Road on west side of I-43. Sat. 8-4 pm, Tues. 8-5pm, is a drop-off site for used motor oil, waste or drain oil in no larger than 2 gallon containers, and other designated recyclables and specific items from Town of Wilson residents only. Will accept car, truck and tractor tires for an additional fee.

MOTOR OIL, TRANSMISSION FLUID, GEAR OIL, AND OLD BATTERIES: Auto Zone, Calumet Drive and Superior Avenue in Sheboygan, recycles used motor oil, used transmission fluid, used gear oil, and takes worn out vehicle batteries during store hours, Mon- Sat. 7:30am –9pm, Sun. 9am-8pm. 920-451-6988

ORGANIC COMPOST Free for Sheboygan residents: Sheboygan Public Works Department on New Jersey Avenue takes leaves, grass clippings, and garden waste, then makes black earth compost over a period of time for redistribution “free” to city residents. The Sheboygan and the Sheboygan Falls DPW each make wood chip mulch, also distributed at no charge to their residents only. Prepare to prove residency. (See Yard Waste listing for yard waste drop-off sites in Sheboygan & Sheb. County)

OUT-DATED MEDICINE SAFE DISPOSAL: The Sheboygan County Planning and Resources Department coordinates waste medication collection disposal programs in a partnership with the Healthy Sheboygan County 2020 Committee and the City of Sheboygan Police Department. There is now a **permanent disposal location, open 24/7** with security, in the lobby of the new **Sheboygan Police Station, 1315 N. 23rd St.** Both prescription and over-the-counter medicines can be deposited there. Leave them in the bottles with labels attached. Black out name or tear off part of label containing only name. The remaining info on the bottle is needed for proper disposal of the different kinds of medication.

Special Collections throughout Sheboygan County continue for outdated medicine safe disposal, during the **first Saturday in October every year** in various communities throughout Sheboygan County. **Call 920-459-3060** for more information.

Please do not dispose of unused or waste medications down the toilet or in the trash.

“PAPER” RECYCLING includes shredded paper, office paper, telephone books, mail order catalogs, cardboard, newspapers, magazines, assorted packaging paper and assorted mixed paper.

All of the above types of paper are accepted by SHEBOYGAN RECYCLING, 8 am–4pm Mon to Fri., 1206 Illinois Avenue, a block north of the corner of Indiana Avenue and 11th Street, then turn left and go one more block to 1206 Illinois. Sometimes Sheboygan Recycling also does pay for paper. 920-457-5091

All of the above types of paper are accepted by CITY OF SHEBOYGAN (as of Jan. 4, 2010) in the Single Stream Recycling program with Veolia.

New Options: NEWSPAPERS, CARDBOARD, AND VARIOUS OTHER TYPES OF PAPER listed at top of this subject listing (“PAPER” RECYCLING), can be placed in the

plastic BLUE BAG along with other Co-Mingled Recyclables or by themselves inside the BLUE BAG. **Note:** Newspapers and flattened cardboard (properly bundled) also may be placed next to the BLUE BAG or next to other regular garbage bags at curbside for weekly pick-up. Check city website for DPW rules www.ci.sheboygan.wi.us or call DPW 920-459-3366

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY: All cities, most all villages and several townships have adopted the single-stream recycling program using Veolia or Larry's Hauling.

Extra note on recycling and waste management: Veolia has a Sheboygan Falls transfer facility to Resource Management (708-425-8565) for taking its collections to 10111 Anderson Ave. Chicago Ridge, IL.

Check with Clerk's Offices for cities, villages or town halls **for specific paper recycling preparation and to confirm list of various papers accepted for recycling**, depending on which recycling collection service is being used.

Other paper recycling spots around the county:

Veolia provides dumpsters for private pick-up of newspaper and flattened cardboard at businesses and apartment/condo complexes in Sheboygan and Sheboygan County.

Kohler-Andrae State Park: Newspaper and flattened Cardboard can be deposited by campers and visitors at Veolia dumpster near campground at west end of park, next to dumpsters for garbage and for co-mingled recyclables

Cedar Grove: Cardboard of all types with inserts removed and flattened and bundled will be taken at the village's drop-off site dumpsters; also newsprint with inserts removed and tied in bundles are accepted at the village's drop-off site, E. Willow Ave. and Commerce Street, on Saturdays, 8am-2pm.

Town of Wilson: Separated paper is accepted at its Maintenance Building/Drop-off Site, 920-980-0198, at 4430 Meyer Court just off the OK frontage road, west of I-43 still referred to be some locals as the Town of Wilson dump. Hours for drop off are Sat, 8-4pm, and Tues, 8-5 pm. Newspapers, magazines, and chipboard are to be bundled (not put in plastic bags), also cardboard is to be flattened and placed in Larry's Hauling dumpsters. Other blue bag recyclables and other designated items are also accepted. There is a garbage compactor at the site for residents who do not order curbside garbage pick-up.

PLASTIC BOTTLES and jugs, sometimes plastic containers 1-7:

Put plastic bottles and jugs, (sometimes plastic containers No. 1-7 depending on local recycling service) in plastic BLUE BAG for Co-mingled recyclables with weekly curbside collection in all communities offering **Single-Stream Recycling:**

Other plastic bottles and jugs recycling spots:

Kohler Andrae State Park: Taken at a dumpster labeled Co-Mingled Recyclables as a service to campers and park visitors near the campground host corner at west end of park.

Cedar Grove: Plastic bottles bagged together in clear bags, also glass (brown, green and clear with caps removed,) also emptied and rinsed aluminum cans only (no tin cans) are accepted at the village's drop-off site dumpsters at E. Willow Ave. and N. Commerce St., Saturdays 8am-2pm.

Town of Wilson: taken at its Maintenance Building/Drop-off Site, 920-980-0198, at 4430 Meyer Court just off the OK frontage road just west of I-43 still referred to be some locals as the Town of Wilson dump. Hours for drop off are Sat, 8-4pm, and Tues, 8-5 pm. Co-mingled recyclables need to be in plastic BLUE BAGS before depositing in Larry's Hauling dumpsters. Paper and other items also taken there. A garbage compactor is at the site for residents who do not order curbside garbage pick-up.

SCRAP METAL FROM AROUND THE HOME:

Two Scrap Metal dealers at 2801 and 3313 N. 21st Street Sheboygan, just north of North Avenue, Sheboygan Scrap Metals, 920-452-1894 and Gus Holman Co., 920-457-2431, will accept old metal clothes hangers, assorted hardware, all metal "worn-out" cooking and eating utensils, solid metal trays, and also aluminum objects including aluminum disposable food trays, pie plates, muffin tins, pie pans, cans, etc.

Veolia Environmental Services, 2905 Paine Ave, Sheboygan, 458-6030, takes scrap metal, also furniture, non freon appliances, and construction debri, (up to a ton for a gate fee of \$27.)

(For Sheboygan residents only): City of Sheboygan Department of Public Works recycling at 2026 New Jersey Avenue site takes scrap metal, also used motor oil, used vehicle batteries, and branches and some yard waste. Mon-Fri. 8am-6pm., Sat.8am-4pm.

THRIFT SHOP DONATIONS are taken at many locations throughout Sheboygan and Sheboygan County. Consider contributing to thrift shops instead of putting still usable good-condition objects out for curbside pick up. Consider buying from thrift shops. Some items are U.S. made goods. When we buy pre-owned goods, we don't require that extra amount of foreign oil to be used to make and to ship new imports here.

Town of Wilson: taken at its Maintenance Building/Drop-off Site, 920-980-0198, at 4430 Meyer Court just off the OK frontage road, west of I-43 still referred to be some locals as the Town of Wilson dump. Hours for drop off are Sat, 8-4pm, and Tues, 8-5 pm. Co-mingled recyclables need to be in blue bags before depositing in dumpsters by Larry's Hauling. Paper and other designated items also accepted. A garbage compactor is at the site for residents who do not order curbside garbage pick-up.

City of Sheboygan: Worn out vehicle batteries may be taken (by Sheboygan residents only) to the Sheboygan Department of Public Works Drop-off site at 2026 New Jersey Ave. M-F, 8-6pm. Sat. 8-4pm. Be prepared to prove residency. DPW, 920-459-3366

Veolia, 2905 Paine Ave., Sheboygan, 458-6030, takes worn out vehicle batteries, \$6 each, open to the public.

YARD WASTE disposal in Sheboygan and Sheboygan County

Note: Due to budget cuts in many government departments, there may be changes announced regarding services or times for yard waste disposal during 2010. Check city and county websites, or phone proper government office for details. This directory will be updated when possible.

City of Sheboygan: Yard waste, grass clippings, and leaves may be taken by Sheboygan residents only to the Sheboygan Department of Public Works recycling center at 2026 New Jersey Avenue. These are converted over the period of several months to compost offered free to Sheboygan residents. Branches and Christmas trees are made into wood chip mulch, which, in turn, is offered free to city residents. Open Mon-Fri. 8-6pm., Sat. 8-4pm. Be prepared to prove city residency.

Cedar Grove: Specific areas for depositing yard waste, also branches accepted anytime at the village's drop off site on the corner of E. Willow Ave. and N. Commerce Street.

Elkhart Lake: The Village Garage, 51 E. Maple St. takes yard and garden waste, leaves and brush from April to October, Sat. 10-3 pm and Wed. 2-6pm.

Howard's Grove: Yard waste may be properly composted on owner's property, also may be disposed of at Larry's Hauling on Balsam Road in the Sheboygan Falls Industrial Park. Larry's Hauling will contract with property owner for pick up. Brush not accepted.

Kohler: Yard waste is picked up in separate containers with the weekly curbside collection by Larry's Hauling.. Residents are not to put yard waste in plastic bags.

Oostburg: Yard clippings can be deposited on Superior Ave. off 11th Street in Oostburg at the Village municipal garage. Larger branches can be taken to Minnesota Ave. next to the railroad tracks.

Plymouth: City Garage, 1004 Valley Road, takes grass clippings, yard and garden waste, also brush during regular working hours, and also on Saturdays from mid-April to mid- November. Hours are posted on the door.

Random Lake: Branches and brush are accepted at the village's shop drop-off site, 690 Wolf Road. (For village residents only)

Sheboygan Falls: Dept. of Public Works, 111 Haman Dr., off Hwy 32 (halfway between County Trunk C and Hwy. 23) takes yard and garden waste and branches which must be removed from plastic bags or containers before being placed on the drop off site. The DPW offers wood chips at the site free for the taking by Sheboygan Falls residents only.

Town of Sheboygan: A drop-off site for town residents only is located at 3770 Enterprise Drive off Hwy 42 next to the water tower in the Town of Sheboygan Business Park (east of I-43.) Accepts leaves, grass clippings, small brush and garden waste.

Town of Wilson: Accepts grass clippings and leaves (not in plastic bags), small amounts of wood and lumber, also branches and brush at its Maintenance Building/Drop-off Site, 920-980-0198, at 4430 Meyer Court just off the OK frontage road, west of I-43 still

referred to be some locals as the Town of Wilson dump. Hours for drop off are Sat, 8-4pm, and Tues, 8-5 pm. Phone 920-980-0198. It also offers wood chips for sale.

YARD WASTE RECYCLING AT HOME OR ON MOST PROPERTIES:

Lawnmowers can be set to the 2 and 1/2 inch height or higher before mowing, then let the grass grow only an inch or two above that setting and mow, allowing the clippings to drop back into the lawn. No need to collect grass clippings if mowing is done weekly. The clippings provide the best natural nitrogen fertilizer to the soil each time the lawn is cut. The secret is to mow often. Worms aid in eating the clippings.

Lawns above 3 inches are more draught resistant, cutting down on watering time and expense. Commercial chemical fertilizers are not needed or seldom needed, saving most of that annual expense.

The leaf trimmings from bushes and other plants, also garden weeds and dead plants can be put in small piles for composting. Add an occasional sprinkling of granulated lime to help the compost piles become black soil compost within a year. Turning the piles a couple of times a year is helpful, too.

These compost piles have almost no odor, if kept to trimmed leaves, autumn leaves and garden waste. Items such as coffee grounds, egg shells and other kitchen cooking refuse produce offensive odors in compost piles. **Trimming from raw or cooked meat or any forms of pet waste are never advised for composting.**

Two small compost piles can be attractively hidden from site easier than one big pile, at little or no cost. Small compost piles seem to produce compost faster than one large one. Other ways to compost include using a worm box or a cylinder bin than turns. Some leaf trimmings from bushes can be tucked under the mulch beneath the bushes in order to provide natural plant food. This is called mulching in place.

(Note: The collectors of this Ecology Directory used several of these methods with good results for 15 years at their former home, before moving to a condo. They received compliments regarding their property being attractive.)

ZEE –Zee what can be done when citizens work together!

The entire FOUR-SECTION ECOLOGY DIRECTORY for Sheboygan and Sheboygan County, including Recycling and Safe Disposal: Household Items A to Z; Ecology Actions – Business Examples; Environmental Groups and Projects; and Community Ecology Wishes, was officially accepted by the City of Sheboygan Common Council at its first Monday meeting, October 2009.
